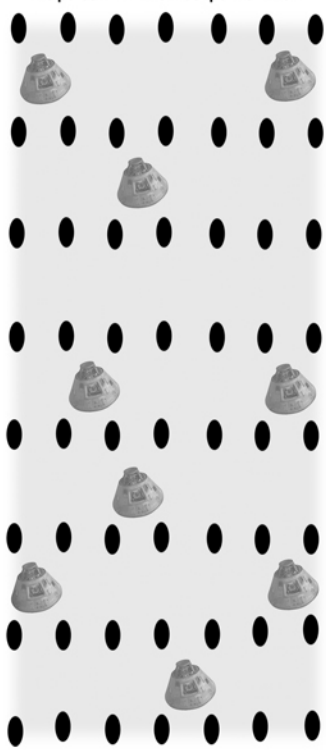

A DRAWING OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN
Start with "foundation" shapes like circles:



Following your basic shapes, add the details of the face and jaw line.

Notice how the foundation lines help "line" everything up. For example, the eyes are now "even"



Continue adding detail. Practice his hair and beard with different textures and shading.
Tip: Turn your pencil to the side for shading.



This exercise is also good practice for drawing portraits of family and friends.

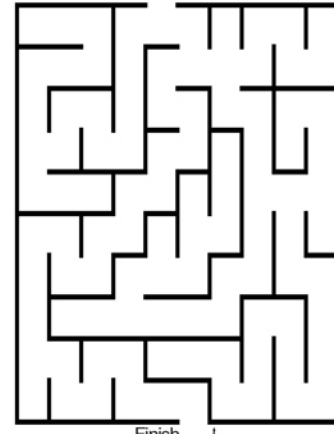
